100% of the long-term capital gains paid by the Gabelli Global Multimedia Trust in 2000 was classified as "20% Rate Gains" subject to a maximum tax rate of 20% (or 10% depending on an individual's tax bracket). Capital gain distributions are reported in box 2a of Form 1099-DIV.

Corporate Dividends Received Deduction and U.S. Government Securities Income:

The percentage of the ordinary income paid by the Gabelli Global Multimedia Trust in 2000 that qualifies for the dividends received deduction available to corporations is 11.56%. The percentage of the ordinary income paid by the Gabelli Global Multimedia Trust in 2000 that was derived from U.S. Government Securities was 17.98%. The percentage of U.S. Government Securities held as of December 31, 2000 was 4.39%. (c)

- (a) Distributions from net investment income and short-term capital gains are taxable as ordinary income and will appear on your Form 1099-DIV under Ordinary Dividends.
- (b) Taxable as long-term capital gains reportable in column (f), line 13 on Form 1040, Schedule D. Since there were no retained capital gains in 2000 Form 2439 will not be necessary.
- (c) Certain states require that 50% of the Fund's portfolio be invested in U.S. Government Securities at the end of each calendar quarter to allow "pass-through" treatment of income derived from U.S. Government Securities. The Trust did not meet this strict requirement in 2000.
